
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HALF STEPS

A HALF-STEP is the distance between any Key and the NEXT nearest Key.




Most HALF-STEPS lie between a White Key and a Black Key.

There are however, two WHITE HALF-STEPS—one between B and C and the other between E and F. Study them on this chart and locate them on your piano keyboard until they can be quickly recognized.

WHOLE STEPS

A WHOLE STEP is twice the distance of a half-step. Therefore, there will always be ONE KEY—either BLACK or WHITE lying between.



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
