America, The Beautiful

Katharine Lee Bates wrote three versions of this song: one in 1893, another in 1904, and a final version in 1913. It has often been referred to as our country's second national anthem. Bates traveled west in 1893, and while inspired on top of Pikes Peak wrote stanzas to what would become *America, the Beautiful*. Although the words have been set to nearly 60 different melodies over the years, we typically hear it sung to the tune you see here, a melody called *Materna* by Samuel A. Ward.
