The Primer B is a natural continuation of the popular Primer A. Filling in the gaps between Primer A and Book One, Primer B has been written to answer the demand for a non-staff edition for young students. The Leila Fletcher primers develop keyboard exploration, musical creativity, aural skills, rhythm concepts, fingering technique and theoretical knowledge. Music basics are introduced at a comfortable rate through tuneful and child-friendly melodies.

The study of music should be a delightful experience. This primer continues in the Leila Fletcher tradition of the ability to read music fluently and interpret it artistically, the establishing of a sound and comprehensive piano technique, the nurturing of the creative musical talent and the fostering of a lasting appreciation of music.

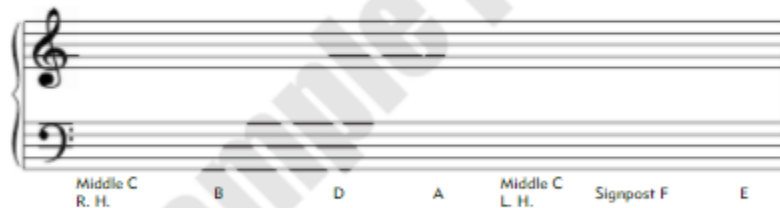

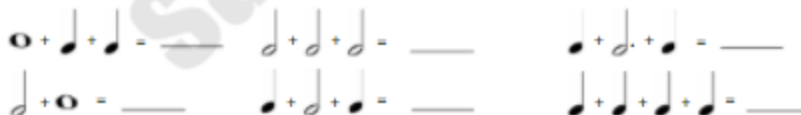
