Saints to light. Fast barred beneath the stone of late in watch and ward where soldiers wait, now shining in triumphant state, He rises Victor from
death's gate. Hell's pains are loosed, and tears are fled; captivity is captive led; the Angel, crowned with light, hath said, "The Lord is risen from the dead."
